

Purpose

The Voluntary Guidelines to Support the Progressive Realization of the Right to Adequate Food in the Context of National Food Security (2004) and the Voluntary Guidelines on Gender Equality and Women's and Girls' Empowerment in the Context of Food Security and Nutrition (2023) emphasize that "ending discrimination in all its forms against women and girls is vital to the realization of women's right to food".

The Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, the International Fund for Agricultural Development, and the World Food Programme have joined efforts with the representations of Malawi and Nepal to raise awareness and identify pathways to accelerate progress toward fully realizing women's and girls' right to food in agrifood systems and beyond.
